Prepositions	in, on, under, next to	
Conjunctions	and, but, or

A sentence is formed with: Subject + Verb + Object

• Example: The dog (Subject) eats (Verb) a bone (Object).

Color-code the parts of the sentence (blue for the subject, red for the verb, green for the object).

Basic tenses with examples:

Tense	Example Sentence	Keywords
Present	l play soccer.	Every day, now
Past	l played soccer.	Yesterday, ago
Future	l will play soccer.	Tomorrow, later

Possessive	My, Your, His, Her, Their	This is her book.
Demonstrative	This, That, These, Those	These are my shoes.

Parts of Speech

Part of Speech	Description	Examples
Verb	an action	I like to work. She is singing.
Noun	a person, place, or thing	Tim is my friend. The school is in London.
Adjective	describes a noun	I have two trees. The trees are big .
Adverb	describes a verb, an adjective, or an adverb	Jen runs quickly . Meg works quietly .
Pronoun	replaces a noun	She wants a snack. It looks great!
Preposition	links a noun to a location or to another word	The bookstore is up the street. We went to school on Monday.
Conjunction	joins parts of sentences or words	I like fruit, and I like vegetables. I like fruit, but I don't like vegetables.



I like to work.



I like to work, too.



"Like" is a verb.

"Work" is a verb, too.





Verb Tenses

Present



Simple Present

We use the simple present tense to talk about things that happen regularly.

I **eat** dinner at 6 p.m. She **plays** basketball. They **go** to Paris in the winter.



Present Continuous

We use the present continuous tense to talk about things that are happening right now.

I am eating lunch. He is playing the violin. They are going to Paris.

Past



Simple Past

We use the simple past tense to talk about things that happened in the past.

I **ate** an orange. He **played** tennis. They **went** to a concert.



Past Continuous

We use the past continuous tense to talk about what was going on during a time in the past.

I was eating breakfast. She was playing in the park. They were going to a festival.



Future



Simple Future

We use the simple future tense to talk about future facts or plans to do something.

I will eat dinner at 6 p.m. He will play soccer tomorrow. They will go to a restaurant.

Conditionals



Present Real Conditional

We use the present real conditional to talk about something that happens and causes another thing to happen.

If I am hungry, I eat a snack.

When she is bored, she plays a game.

When they are tired, they go to the hotel.
